Leaving the Classroom

Chromebooks

Students are expected to bring a charged Chromebook with them to class each day. Students who need to borrow a Chromebook from the library should do so prior to the start of class. Students can expect to use their Chromebooks daily.

Make-Up Work

Per the student handbook, students, when absent, are responsible for make-up work. As a general rule, two days will be allowed for each day of EXCUSED absence and one day for each additional absence per occurrence. A zero will be entered into the gradebook until the assignment is turned in. Once the assignment is submitted, the zero will be removed and a grade will be entered within approximately one week. Students should check Google Classroom for missed assignments.

No extension will be granted for work missed due to an UNEXCUSED absence. Similar, students who miss class due to a student activity will be expected to complete assignments on schedule. Students should communicate planned absences PRIOR to missing class.

Late Work

Students are expected to complete all graded work on time. Failure to do so will result in a zero in Skyward. In the event that a student knows in advance that they may have trouble completing an assignment on time, it is important that they communicate with Ms. Weigel prior to the assignment's deadline. Doing so may result in an extension for the assignment.

Cheating, including plagiarism—the submission of another's work as one's own, is a serious academic issue and will not be tolerated. The likely consequence of cheating and/or intentional plagiarism will be a zero on the assignment in question.

To avoid plagiarism, students will be expected to properly document any and all borrowed information using MLA guidelines. Students should use the [OWL at Purdue website](#) to learn more about proper documentation.

To help students monitor the integrity of their written assignments, students will be required to submit all formal writing assignments to turnitin.com. A similarity report will be created upon submission. Submissions that receive a high similarity report will be reviewed for evidence of plagiarism.
